










Early Years Curriculum









Continuous Provision

Children access 'Continuous Provision' throughout Nursery and Reception.

'Continuous Provision' → Constant Environment that is safe for children to explore whilst challenging their learning.








Phonics

- As well as other activities that change regularly!












Tapestry Learning Journals

- Parental contributions are important and we use these to support our work in class.
- Remember to complete the consent form and email it to the school.





Additions to the typical day

- ▶ Collective Worship
 - ▶ Daily worship together in the hall as a whole school or in class
- Services are also held at St Alfege Church

- ▶ PE
 - Once a week
 - ► Children change into and out of PE kit
 - Professional sports coach



Lunchtime Arrangements

- Children choose their lunches at the beginning of the day.
- Their meals are ready for them when they come into the hall.
- Play in the Magic Garden.
- Strong communication between teacher and Midday Meal Supervisors.



School Lunches

Your child will be eligible for universal free meals when they start Reception until the end of Year 2 (while the government scheme is in place).

We will assume your child is having school dinners when they start unless you inform us by their first day that you will be providing a packed lunch.

Children must stay with the same meal option for at least a half term and you must let the office know before the end of any half term if they will be changing their meal arrangement for the next half term.



Attendance and punctuality

- > All children must attend school regularly and on time.
- > If your child is ill, you must phone in by 9.00am to let us know.
- Doctors notes/appointment letters must be provided for medical appointments.
- If your child has sickness/diarrhoea, this is one of the illnesses that has a 48 hour policy, therefore you must keep your child off school for at least 48 hours after their last episode.

School Uniform



- A uniform that all children are proud to wear.
- School sweatshirt or cardigan in green with school logo.
 - Available from Whitehall clothiers (flyer in admission packs)
- White shirt or polo shirt.
- Grey/black trousers or skirt.
- Black shoes or trainers.
- In summer, children may wear a green check dress.
- ► Hair accessories in school colours no bows
- A sensible school bag for carrying books.
- For health and safety reasons, only stud earrings and a watch are permitted.
- Please ensure all uniform has your child's name written clearly

P.E. Kit

Children must be suitably dressed for an essential part of the curriculum.

White or green t-shirt.

Black tracksuit bottoms/shorts
